The VOICE Specialist provides independent living services to persons who experience a disability and seniors, using the consumer-directed independent living model. The VOICE Specialist develops personalized plans alongside consumers to achieve independence goals and coordinates with a wide range of support services, including oversight of the veteran direct care program in Juneau which provides participant-directed in-home care services to veterans.
